How I Became an Antique Car Buff

Since 1953 I have been interested in old cars. At that time I was unmarried and lived on a small farm with my folks. One day my father and I were cleaning the property of accumulated junk that was around the farm. There were various old farm equipment that was either out dated and left out in the woods or it was worn out. Aside from that type of junk there was several old cars and trucks, two 1938 Chevy 2 doors, 1936 Chevy 4 door, a 1929 Buick which was made into a flat bed truck, a 1936 Chevy pickup and two Model 'A' chassis that were made into flat bed trucks too.

While cleaning and hauling all of the junk, I kept looking at those Model 'A' chassis, they were nearly complete. One was a

1929 and the other a 1931. I can recall learning how to drive on the 1929. My father had bought that one while he was building the house back in 1932. It originally was a panel delivery. Several years later he was doing a little farming and thought that it would be more useful as a flat bed truck. So he cut the body off and built a flat bed on it. The other chassis was bought for \$2,500 at a farm auction during the early forties. (Continued on Page 4)






SUNSHINE

As I sit here writing this column it's warm and sunny. Just a few short weeks ago we had snow, the day



How I became an Antique Car Buff (Continued)

I made up my mind that I was going to get one of these running again. I remember the day that my father and I pulled them to the edge of the farm, that was 7 or 8 years before. Before that they were parked in a shed for about 5 years. All toll they had not run for about 12-13 years.

I tried to turn the engines and they both turned, even though the hood was blown off the 1929 and the other had only a partial hood on. They both had small amounts of water in the crankcase. I then doubted that they would ever run. However, I wanted to try to get one running anyway. I drained and changed the oil. The distributor was in very bad condition. The cap was missing and everything was rusted. After removing from the engine and taking out all the badly rusted parts I went to a local auto parts dealer and surprisingly had everything I needed. (I didn't know any antique part dealers even existed then.) It only cost me about \$1.50 to buy points, condenser, cam, rotor, distributor body and cap. After putting the distributor together and installed in the engine, I called a neighbor friend of mine and he told me how to set the timing. Next I had to use a pipe wrench to remove the badly rusted plugs. The store where I bought the distributor parts didn't have the plugs so I just cleaned and set the gap and put them back in.

The carburetor was another problem I had to work out. An insect made a nest in the choke area and the throttle and choke plate were rusted fast. By soaking the carburetor in kerosene for a day, I was able to take it apart. I cleaned and freed the plates and put the carburetor back on the engine.

After filling the radiator I found it had a number of small leaks, but it was good enough to see if the motor would run. I put gas in and worried if the carburetor would get dirty again because inside the tank looked very rusty. I hooked the battery up and tried to start it. The starter turned the motor three times with the choke pulled closed, and to my surprise it ran. It did not have a muffler on it so I • could not determine how good the motor really was although it did not smoke. I drove it around and everything . worked good even the brakes.

While I was fixing this chassis to run I found out that Sears Robuck sold Model 'A' parts through the catalog. From them I purchased a muffler and some other small parts like timing gear, etc. I must have drove that chassis around the farm for a year or more. I also got the other running but it did not sound as good as the first one.

I then bought some books on antique cars and after purchasing Floyd Clymers and Les Henry's "Fabulous Model 'A'", I knew I was an old car buff, especially for the Model 'A'. It was then that I started to look for a Model 'A' body or a complete car. After two or three months I found a 1930 coupe that I could buy for \$125.00 The car was in very poor condition. It did not run and had body rust. However, after about a year of work, and putting that body on the running chassis. I had a presentable car that I ran for 7 years as a second car. The complete restoration of the coupe is another story that I may write soon.

As I look back now I should have saved all the other brand X cars and that 1929 Buick. I guess many people say

that now. I am now married and have a lovely wife and 2 find boys. I now own several Model 'A' cars which I hope to restore someday. Our favorite is a 1929 Model 'A' closed cab pickup with a canopy top and screened sides. We have a lot of fun going to meets and to parades in it.

This is my story of how I got started with antique cars and it is a great hobby.
