





With Sorrow we report the passing of Long Time Member Frank Heiss, Sr. 1930-2015

At age 85 Frank Heiss, Sr. went to be with his LORD and his wife, Edith who preceded him in death in 2003. Frank died at home after a long battle with illness with his family by his side. Frank lapsed into an unconscious state the day before his passing; his condition had been deteriorating for several years.

Frank was a pillar of the South Jersey Region who was a charter member having been one of the group of Brandywine Region AACA Members back in 1966 from South Jersey who wanted to start an AACA Region on this side of the bridge. In his "hey-day" he organized tours and was a senior judge for AACA. He was also a presenter at the Annual Meeting in



Philadelphia as late as 1996 doing seminars on "Classic Cars"

We all have funny stories, I am sure, to tell about Frank Heiss. He once told me he started taking in some body work at home as a hobby and registered the name "Franklin Auto Body" to obtain a discount at the parts counter. By 1960 he had six men working for him including one of the men who helped him learn the trade.

Frank was famous for his reconstruction and restoration of Duesenbergs, Cords and Auburns. He owned Miss Cord's car and Amelia Earhart's 1929 Boat-tail Speedster. Frank began his career in auto body building at the Budd Company in Philadelphia.

He even drew the attention of comedian and latenight entertainer, Jay Leno, who invited Frank and

Edie to see his car museum in California and Jay came to West Deptford, New Jersey to visit them and see Frank's collection and shop.

Frank was a proud veteran serving in the Korean War and was a long-time member of the Masonic Lodge where he held many key positions including Master of the Florence Lodge #87 F & AM.

Frank was the all-time record holder for story telling in the South Jersey Region sharing story-afterstory, each one more interesting and informative than the last one. He was hard-of-hearing so he spoke in a very loud voice. He loved to dance, was funny, loyal and patriotic and often got emotional when relating some of his life experiences.

The Love of His Life was "The Red Head" Edith. or Edie as we knew her, who he met when she was only 14. They were married over 50 years. Edie was fascinating in her own right having once been a seamstress for the famous Hollywood Designer, Edith Head.

Frank in the last couple days of his life was rambling to Frank, Jr. and told him there was something he wanted him to do. He wanted him to buy Edie a birthday present. Catering to his father's wish Frankie asked his Dad what he should buy? Frank replied, "buy her a white blouse." Frankie said that was the last words he heard his father utter, but his last audible sound was him singing Happy Birthday to Edie. How precious! Oh that we could all leave this earth singing.

Thanks Frank, for a lifetime of memories.
