# **AUTOMOTIVE TRIVIA Did You Know?**



- In 1913, Maine & Vermont were deciding if eight miles per hour was too fast for an automobile to travel.
- The gasoline gauge on the instrument panel was introduced in 1923.
- Bumpers became optional equipment in 1906.
- Left hand steering was introduced by Ford in 1901.
- In 1905, cars were first sold on the installment plan.
- The word "automobile" first appeared in Youth's Companion magazine in 1896.
- The Ford Motor Company reported profits of over one million dollars in 1907.
- In 1899, Boston parks were closed to motor vehicles during the day to reduce accidents caused by runaway horses.
- Taxi cab service started in New York in 1898. The vehicles were electric powered.
- The rear view mirror was first used in the 1911 Indianapolis 500 race.
- The first speeding ticket was issued in 1902 to a man going ten miles per hour. His fine was \$10.
- Henry Ford's first motor vehicle in 1894 went forward but not backward.
- Goodrich introduced tubeless tires in 1948.

# FIRE CRACKERS

From the Kitchen of Sara Swann (Friend of Linda McFarland)



1 1/2 Cup Canola Oil

1 pkg. ranch dressing mix

2 Tbsp. crushed red pepper 1 box of crackers (Saltines/Oyster/Wheat Ritz)

## 2 1-gallon ziplock bags

Put 2 sleeves of crackers in each bag. Pour half of the mixture in each bag. Knead or shake several times over a 24 hour period. She actually divides the recipe in two measuring cups.

(I have actually never made this recipe but Sara brought these to our ladies retreat and they were excellent.)





#### MY FIRST CAR

I was a high school student in a small town in Tennessee in 1956. My father felt it was a good time for me to learn to drive. In Tennessee a person

could obtain a driving license at the age of 16. I think it may still be the law. He felt at 14 it might take me two years to learn how to drive. He proceeded to purchase a 1939 Ford Sedan for an ample sum of \$50.00. At the time we lived on a dead-end street made up of six houses on each side of a small creek with the street running down the middle. My dad would drive the car on Sunday morning and Wednesday afternoon to the lake to go fishing. I was permitted to drive the car all of the other time so long as I did not get off of our dead-end street. My friend, Jim, was having the same opportunity with a World War II jeep. He was told not to drive off of the street. As things go we learned rather quickly about gears and speed plus a few other tricks. Things were going well until one uncontrollable afternoon we took out the side of the bridge over the creek. Jim lost the use of the slightly

damaged jeep. I on the other hand was luckier. Going a little fast and breaks being a little weak caused my experience to end up at the lower end of the creek in about three feet of water. Jim and I walked for a while afterwards. That is not the end of the Ford story.



When I turned sixteen and earned my operator's license the

1939 Ford was given to me full time. It was a fun car but I wanted to go more modern. I offered the Ford for sale and immediately got a buyer. I sold the car for \$75.00. Shortly after the buyer came back wanting to return the car. It seems he had a bad driving record and was unable to get a tag for the car. Being the nice person I was, I offered to buy the car back for \$50.00. He accepted. I kept the car for another year, I do not think the oil was ever changed, and to upgrade, I sold it for \$100. That went toward a 1950 Ford that I drove for several years. Been down-hill ever since.
