After a lot of hard work in prepping and preparing his SRT6 for this event, he came away with a 1st Place Win, besting others which also attended throughout the country!!


Here he is receiving his award with David Rea, a famous celebrity from our hobby from Velocity/Motor Trend TV. Great job, Tyler!!




Tyler's car is a 2006 Crossfire SRT6, which is a special edition of the Chrysler Crossfire which was offered for the 2004 to 2008 model years. The Chrysler Crossfire

is a two-seat sports car formed from the collaboration between the engineers from Chrysler and Mercedes during their shared ownership during the mid-1990's through late 2000's. The SRT6 editions were produced only for two model years (2005 and 2006) in limited quantities, with 2006 being special order only. What makes the SRT6 models unique from other Crossfires is that it features all of the performance upgrades available from Chrysler's and Mercedes' performance divisions (AMG and SRT). Each SRT6 were powered by an AMG hand assembled supercharged and intercooled 3.2L V6 engine


producing an underrated 330hp and 310lb-ft of torque (versus 215hp and 220lb-ft from the base Crossfire models). Other SRT6 specific feature include suspension and brake upgrades, 19" rear and 18" front cast aluminum wheels, a special front fascia with lowered air dam, a large fixed rear spoiler, unique Alcantara upholstered leather interior, and special badging.





All SRT6's were mated to the AMG 5-speed Auto-Stick Transmission

All 2006 SRT6's were special made-to-order vehicles



0-60mph – 4.7 seconds Top Speed – 155mph (electronically governed) The added uniqueness of Tyler's 2006 Chrysler Crossfire SRT-6 is as follows:

It is 1 of 47 LHD coupes produced Worldwide

It is 1 of 12 allocated for the United States market

It is 1 of 1 in Graphic Metallic (color was not available for MY2006)

Vehicle was specifically built for a Chrysler Executive for Public Relations use Its recognized in the SRT6 community as the "Unicorn", as its VIN is well known and most people are surprised that an executive vehicle became available for private ownership

Tyler has spent a tremendous amount of effort in compiling all of the original equipment in returning his SRT6 car back to OEM standards due to its uniqueness. His efforts in detailing the vehicle was reflected on his recent award at the 2019 Chrysler Nationals in Carlisle, Pennsylvania.





As proud Pontiac owners we just had to take the opportunity to attend the POCI convention. The event is held at a different venue each year and Gettysburg is so close to home. It helps that this is the 3rd year in a row we have been at the Wyndham in Gettysburg for some antique car activity.

We are accustomed to AACA events and the POCI is a little bit different, but car enthusiasts are pretty much the same everywhere you go. Each vehicle entered has to go through a technical inspection process and any Pontiac is eligible to enter, regardless of age. There are two major categories, "points judged" and "popular vote". Points judges classes are Survivor, Modified, Stock,

Champion and Original Owner. Popular vote is over 50 classes covering any and all model of Pontiacs.

My wife Maria and I arrived in Gettysburg on Monday afternoon on the first day of the POCI Convention. Other members of the South Jersey Region were Jim and Donna Vertolli and (the other) Ron and Annette Scott.

I went through early bird registration, points judged tech inspection, official photo and then parked the Grand Prix and covered it, where it would stay for the remainder of the show. Besides a battlefield tour and a little museum side trip, the next 3 days were spent watching the cars go through tech inspection. This was a pretty good spot, in the shade of the overhang at the side entrance of the Wyndham, just a few steps from some a/c and water. From there I was able to see a good percentage of the cars that were attending the show. This turned out to be a blessing since Friday and

Saturday were so hot that I could pick and choose what I wanted to look at and not feel I missed many cars. There were over 500 cars in attendance.

Jim Vertolli was able to contact a large percentage of the owners of the 1958's at the show. He put up signs, he left notes, he talked to everyone – getting the word out that he wanted to get all these great cars together for a group photo. And boy! What a success! He ended up with 10 cars and owners, lined up in the blazing heat with photos galore. Everyone who participated was so excited. Like I said, car enthusiasts are the same wherever you go!

Ron Scott had his '51 Sedan Delivery it received a lot of

attention all week. People really love this old "under construction" survivor and its distinctive look.

Friday morning, the day of the points judged show, started out with a pleasant surprise. A gentleman came up to me while I was prepping the car for the show and told me that he was the previous owner of my car. I bought the car through a consignment company and it is their policy to keep the 2 sides confidential. He introduced himself and his wife and was very happy

and excited to see the car and that it was in great shape. He had owned the car for 22 years and had bought it from the original owner with 5000 miles in 1995. Over those 22 years it was entered in POCI events and won a Senior Gold, was entered in AACA National events and won National First Prize Junior, all of this and only accumulating 4000 more miles. The car was trailered and pampered and had 9000 miles when I purchased it.

We exchanged contact information and have already made some trades. I am sending him the 3 grill badges the car earned while he owned it and in return he will be sending me a copy of a sub feature article done on the car in Smoke Signals, and the ORIGINAL price sticker and shipping documents from the dealer (not reproductions and the dealer has not existed for some time).

Connecting with the previous owner was an unexpected highlight of my POCI experience. Awards night exceeded our expectations when the car was awarded Junior Gold in Survivor class, attaining a score above 390 out of 400. Jim Vertolli received a Gold award in the

AACA NATIONAL VINTAGE TOUR

"Welcome to Canada Eh!

August 4-9, 2019—Kingston, Ontario

Washrooms, Loonies, Toonies, Kilometers, all things metric....These were all new to us as we started on our Vintage Tour in Kingston, Ontario.

We left New Jersey early Sunday morning, August 4th and set out with our 1929 Model 'A' Ford safely tucked away in our trailer. We had an 8 hour drive ahead of us. Raymond & Judy Fischer, South Jersey members, had already arrived in Kingston on Saturday.

We arrived in Kingston around 4:30 pm and were greeted by one of our hosts, Lynne Konarowski who promptly gave us our registration paperwork. The hotel had ample parking for many trailers. There were 40 automobiles expected to be on the tour from 1907 to 1931.

We had a welcome banquet at the hotel that evening and were thrilled to meet many of the folks we have toured with on past tours.

Raymond & Judy Fischer were driving the trouble truck & trailer in case there were any breakdowns. We had decided we would stay with them through the week, in case Raymond needed any help with vehicles. Luckily, we had a good week and no one had to use the trailer. We were always the last to leave the parking lot each morning.

Monday, we left the hotel by 8:30 am and our first stop was a coffee break in Sydenham where we enjoyed goodies at the Royal Canadian Legion Branch 496 and visited a unique general store named Trousdale's.

Canada's oldest family owned general store.

Our next stop was a drive to Westport and the Carriage Shop. Where we saw many beautifully restored carriages.

Lunch on our own in downtown Westport. After lunch we traveled more back roads passing the Rideau Canal System Locks. The Rideau Canal was built in the 1830s from Kingston to Ottawa. We traveled a total of 92 miles this day and enjoyed spectacular scenery.

The photo to the right is of our '29 Ford riding

down the road and the view the Fischers had each day. Note the speed limit sign "50" Km" which is approximately 31 miles per hour for us.

Something we got accustomed to was whenever we needed a "restroom", the Canadians referred to them as "washrooms". Something else we had to get used was the Canadian currency and coins. They had paper currency, which was really colorful, but they also have a \$2

coin known as a "Toonie" and a \$1 coin known as a "Loonie". Our currency was worth more than the Canadian currency by approximately 20%. So a \$1.00 Canadian is .80 cents US. We used our credit card for all of our purchases since we would not have to worry about the exchange rate and the Credit Card Company would automatically give us the exchange rate.

Tuesday we were driving to Odessa for our coffee break hosted by the Antique & Classic Car Club of Canada, Upper Canada Region. Their Club house was beautiful and located on the Odessa Fairgrounds. The members of that region baked for our group and there were 3 tables of homemade breads, cakes and muffins to choose from.

After coffee break we traveled approximately 30 miles to the Glenora open car ferry and then to the Waupoos Winery for a luncheon. Unfortunately the weather did not cooperate and the sky opened up for a short while at the winery but most of us stayed dry under the tents provided for our luncheon. Several of us tasted

some of the wines of the region and purchased some for home.

After the winery we traveled approximately 47 miles back to the hotel in Kingston. Tuesday, we traveled a total of 98 miles.

The Stirling area was known for its large dairy farms and cheese making heritage. Farm Town Park was a look back at what agricultural and rural life was like in the 30's and 40's, from the early days of cheese making to life in a small town. There were 9 buildings

> to discover the many antique artifacts and machinery that was used back in those days. They also had a "Main Street" Heritage Village


that was recreated with 18 store fronts, including a chapel, gas station, general store, etc. This is where we had our luncheon.

After Farm Town we traveled approximately 16 miles (45 minutes driving time) to the National Air Force Museum of Canada, by way of several Locks crossing the Trent River and the Trent-Severn Waterway that was developed for economic and military reasons in the 1800s.

By the time we reached the Air Force Museum the sky opened up and the rain came down hard. But the rain ended by the time we left the museum and headed back to the hotel.

Total driving distance for Wednesday was 136 miles.



We got to see the beautiful 1,000 islands area by boat.

Below is a photograph of the Boldt Castle on Alexandria Bay that was built in 1900 by George Boldt, who owned the Waldorf Astoria in New York. Tours are available of the castle and its grounds.

Our total driving distance on Thursday was 75 miles.

Friday was our short day where we visited the historic Fort Henry in Kingston. The

Fort Henry National Historic Site (1832) has been beautifully restored and well kept. We had lunch at the bistro there and then drove just across the road to the Military

Communications Museum.

Some of our best times have been with friends and old cars, and when you combine them, everything just gets better and better.

It seems like every time you turn around there is another attempt by a city, county, or state to legislate, or to limit our use and enjoyment of our old cars. That's where my job comes in – and where each of you can make a difference. As VP Legislation, part of what I do is to try to follow legislative efforts which affect the antique vehicle hobby. Contact with our SEMA representative Colby Martin and the SEMA Action Network helps to maintain awareness of issues nationwide, as well as State-to-State.

You and your Region can step up and keep us aware of what is going on in your part of the United States and Canada that the rest of us may not know about, and how it can affect the hobby.

The hobby, with the support of many legislatures (https://www.semasan.com/legislative-alerts/ national/sema-applauds-introduction-congressionalresolution-recognizing-july-12) just celebrated Collector Car Appreciation Day on Friday, July 12th. I hope that you and your Region participated in some way. Here in Louisiana, our many varied clubs had planned to converge on Baton Rouge to visit the Old State Capitol. Regrettably, Hurricane/Tropical Storm Barry made that impossible as much of the southern part of the state was shut down, and driving anything was discouraged. A follow-up event is planned.
