See you down the road.



Meeting was adjourned at 7:45 pm


Hagley Museum Car Show (Continued)

The Hagley had several featured cars on display and Gary and Bonnie Green's 1924 Overland was one of the featured cars.

Below is a written history about the Overland by it's owner, Benjamin Shimp, Sr.

Ben Shimp, Jr. put the Overland in his garage on blocks in 1978 and it never came out until his widow placed the car at auction in 2015 when it was purchased by Gary and Bonnie.

This 1924 Overland was purchased in Chicago, Illinois in 1924 and driven to St. Petersburg, Florida by the original owner in 1925. It was stored in his garage that year, on blocks, and remained there until purchased on September 23, 1953 for \$70



by Mr. M.C. Simpson of St. Petersburg, Florida. The mileage at that time was 6,181. It was necessary to remove a tree and a fence to get the garage doors open and remove the car. Adding only gas, water and oil, Mr. Simpson was able to start the engine while the car was still on blocks, using the original spark plugs and wires. His only attempt at restoration was to paint the car solid black and to purchase tires.

In 1954 the car was purchased by my son, who brought it to New Jersey when he moved here in 1959. Having long been interested in the car, in 1961 I began its restoration, assisted by my son. The car was completely dissembled. All original plate glass was replaced with safety plate. By 1963 the exterior was refinished in midnight blue and black Duco to duplicate the original finish. The only major problem was procuring 31 X 4 straight side tires. The half-finished car was stored until late 1965, when these tires were finally obtained.

The interior and top were completed in January, 1966 by Mr. C. Rau of Camden Auto Top. After years of searching for the correct materials, a mohair seat fabric in a pattern very close to original was obtained from Stitt's in Trenton. As the "salt and pepper" velour originally used for the balance of the interior is no longer available, a plain velour was of necessity substituted. This was also purchased from Mr. Stitt, who advised me that this velour was from a lot that had been manufactured in the early 1920's. The floor mat and top materials duplicate the original in color and texture.

Owned and operated by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, this waterfront historic site is located inside the original 18th century pump house that once controlled the water levels in the locks along the first edition of the canal.









After touring the C & D Canal Museum we traveled a short distance to North East, Maryland where we visited the Upper Bay Museum. This museum was a wonderful collection of artifacts that preserve the lifestyle of the watermen and hunters of the Chesapeake Bay.









After touring the Upper Bay Museum we drove a few blocks to the lovely town of North East and toured their shops. We then had an early dinner at Woody's Crab House where we enjoyed delicious seafood dinners.

Easy Washing Machine Salesman's Car

Back in the Model "T" Ford days, it was popular to display a product that was for sale on the back of a <u>salesman's car</u>. A coupe or a roadster with the addition of an accessory pickup box or a platform and some signage made for the perfect way to display the goods and keep them in the view of potential prospects. This Ford coupe is either a 1926 or '27 model.

The <u>Syracuse Washing Machine</u> <u>Corporation</u> located in Syracuse, New York was the producer of the <u>Easy Washing Machine</u> between 1877 to 1967. The early machines were hand-powered and as the years passed the Easy washer was powered by either a 1/6 h.p. electric motor or a small <u>gasoline-powered engine</u> at the time this photo was taken.

110 Years Ago: Automobile Non-Carbon Gasoline Supply Station



My how things have changed in the last 110 years. This circa 1908 to '12 image taken at a gasoline station located at two West 6th St. in Brooklyn, NY, demonstrates just how primitive early filling stations where. The automobile being re-fueled is a 1911 or earlier White steam car.

This business apparently operated out of a small shack on the side of the street and supplied motorists with gasoline and possibly kerosene. Instead of using a

rubber hose, fuel was dispensed out of a series of iron pipes connected with some type of an adjustable joint that must have leaked (note the funnel and jug on the side of the building.) We do not know exactly what was used to power light above the car, although it certainly looks like it could have been a fire hazard.


