South Jersey Region members toured to Hershey and had a great experience at the National headquarters. In the new building there is esthetic beauty and very modern technology; but most importantly, the facility that houses the offices and the history of this organization to which we belong works for the members.

We were warmly welcomed by Steve Moskowitz, CEO of our organization, Jennifer Wolf, Librarian Director and Matt Hocker one of the other two librarians. Our group was then taken through an interesting tour of each part of this facility. It was truly a "behind the scenes" experience.

The initial experience was the visual impact as we enter the display of the antique vehicles and then to go into the Library area and be able to see and understand how the files, the organization and especially the entire library can now operate in such a modern technological way to facilitate each of we members in our needs for our restorations of our vehicles of all eras and all types.

Every member has access to this knowledge with a selected time of free research done for you by the librarians and in person or ways to receive this from this building to your home. This is a great gift to the membership of AACA. It is also a library available to non-members who do pay. This research is accessible from all over the world to the automobile hobbyist. The AACA Library has accessible storage for their amazing collection of automotive literature. Our touring group from SJ now knows how the "files and stacks" move and the importance of proper temperature and storage is to preserve our interest in the all parts of this hobby.

This building on the first level has gorgeous display cases housing the original National Award pieces which



provide the names of the National Awards given at the annual AACA Convention. A kiosk now is there to type in a name and locate a NATIONAL award presented to an AACA member at these annual conventions.

The cars on display in this open first floor area provide a wonderful experience of seeing the beginning of the automobile through many years; from the simple motors through the race car to the most expensive motor vehicle. All vehicles are displayed with seeing the mounted story of the vehicles on display. Pedal cars and toy related to automobilia are positioned around to bring additional joy to this visit.







This museum is no longer affiliated with the National AACA but does give all AACA members free admission for any visits. It was another wonderful few hours of enjoying the vehicles of many eras. The displays were arranged to help us enjoy each vehicle's history and contribution to their advancements from a view of an old type workshop to a dedicated wing for the development of the Tucker car. Within the building we enjoyed displays formotorcycles, a diner, buses, trucks and so much more seen in settings that enhanced the vehicle or artifact that pertained to automotive history. The artistic backgrounds present the vehicle or item in an appropriate era, location or use. Explanations and the history and dedication is listed for each. There is a fabulous model railroad display that we enjoyed.

The day finished with an afternoon stop at Funck's Restaurant in Palmyra, PA.
