

2025 Eastern Divisional Tour – Presque Isle, Maine

On a sweltering day in August several members of the SJRAACA made their way to the wilds of northern Maine. Presque Isle practically Canada! It's a long trip, 700 miles (give or take), one way. Some folks had adventures, I will let them share their stories. We had great representation from our club. In addition to us, we had Chuck and Joyce Gibson, Gary and Bonnie Green, Terry Shelton and Miriam Willis, and the three Hamiltons – Gene, Michelle and Kyle. I believe we had the second largest contingent attending, way to go!

Don and I took the time to make a stop in South Portland to catch up on some family time. As usual, traffic through New Jersey, Connecticut and Massachusetts was a total blast (not). It was nice to have a stop after a long 8-hour day.



On Monday, August 11, we left and made our way to Presque Isle. Once you get up past Bangor the traffic really thins out and you start to see the Maine wilderness. As we checked in, we came across many old friends, which is always great. Our hotel was charming with a really “cozy” room. After settling in we made our way through town to the “Car Barn” of our host, Craig Green. A very nice meet and greet with the Maine Region folks and especially our National President and First Lady, Dave and Debra Anspach.

Tuesday found us leaving the hotel at 8:00 AM. This was a LONG day of touring, over 170 miles, looping west from town, up north, east and south back to the hotel. Beautiful views of mountains, hills, farms, rivers, lakes, little towns – Maine has a bit of everything. We ended up in Fort Kent where we had the opportunity to visit the fort – provided you were clever and motivated enough to navigate the construction! This is also where Route 1 starts and as you stand at that point you are right by the Customs Port of Entry into Canada. Everyone kept their passports close at hand, it would not have taken too much to end up on the other side of the border!

Our next stop was Ayotte Farms to check out some tractors and automotive memorabilia.



Lunch was a buffet at the Lake View Restaurant, and we had the time to meet some new friends. And eat. After lunch it was off to Madawaska and a trip around Pelletier Island. We get

to this interesting island via a causeway with no guardrails! But everyone navigated that safely. The island is a bit of a closed community, due to its isolation farmers grow “seed crops” of potatoes that are then used throughout northern Maine.



Side note – Maine produces 4% of the entire potato crop in the USA and Aroostook County produces over 90% of that 4%. Who knew?

Back to Madawaska where we visited the “Four Corners” park. For motorcyclists this is the northeastern most stop on the USA four corners tour – in 21 days (or less) to ride your motorcycle to these Four Corner cities of the United States: San Ysidro, CA; Blaine, WA; Madawaska, ME; and Key West, FL, using any route and sequence. And you thought WE liked to drive.

Next stop was the renovation of a cathedral, which we passed up, but from what I heard it was very interesting and beautiful. If anyone was hungry (really?!) there were some ice cream stops on the way back to the hotel. We were on our own for dinner but there was entertainment in the ballroom, local musician Dan Rooney, and other cocktails and snacks.



Wednesday and another early start. This time we headed south on Route 1 towards Mars Hill. Along the way it was fun to spot the sculptures in miles long art installation of the solar system. The scale model starts with the Sun in Presque Isle and eventually ends 100 miles down the road in Topsfield. Our travels only took us to Pluto in Houlton. Our first stop was the Agricultural Museum, but it turned out to be closed. Someone didn't get the memo about our visit. Oops, these things happen on tour, you have to be flexible! Well, it was a way to get the group of 45 or so cars clumped up for the next stop, which was the Presque Isle/Houlton INTERNATIONAL Airport. International?!

The Airport was critical in WW II with a runway that spans the US-Canadian border, so technically planes could taxi from the US over to Canada for take off and not necessarily be war bound (before we joined the fray). The area also served as a POW camp.

Fascinating.

We left the airport and headed west to Shin Pond for our picnic lunch. More small towns and views of Mount Katahdin. Shin Pond Village had a little general store for some souvenir shopping. Hot dogs, hamburgers, desserts and a cool presentation of some Teddy Roosevelt artifacts.

Next stop was the Patten Lumbermen's Museum. I am sorry to say that the building with the presentation was so hot I just couldn't bear it! The first few days of our trip had temperatures of 95 and over. It was hotter in northern Maine than it was in New Jersey! That was unexpected and surprised everyone, locals included. We got back in the nice, air-conditioned car and headed to the ice cream stop.

There was an optional activity after dinner, a visit to the Vera Estey House, just a block or two from the hotel. The Estey House is a lovely 12 room Victorian home, owned by Vera Estey and willed to the Presque Isle Historical Society upon her death. We got a tour of the home and lots of local color and stories. Our guides were Kim Smith and our AACA tour leader Craig Green. Kim also attended all stops on the tour and gave us history and background on all things Maine. Her knowledge and enthusiasm was unmatched. A terrific addition to the tour in general. This day was another long day of touring, almost 200 miles.

Thursday was an easier day, a later start and less than 100 miles touring and the hot weather broke. Our first stop took us north and east to the Aroostook Valley Country Club. Of interest here, the club spans the US-Canadian border, and you need to pass through Customs to play! The border is literally a sign saying no access. We left the AVCC and headed to Mars Hill where we saw a windmill farm and more incredible views, and a very long dirt road. Lunch was at the Big Rock Mountain Ski Lodge, pulled pork barbeque and chicken. We were also entertained by Kim Smith with the story of Bernard Patterson and the Great Mars Hill Bank Robbery. A strange tale of a colorful local man and his international crime spree!

We left the lodge and made our way to a monument celebrating the lift off of the Double Eagle II Balloon. The Double Eagle II completed the first transatlantic balloon flight, landing in a barley field near Paris, 137 hours after lifting off from Presque Isle, Maine. Does anyone remember this from August 17, 1978? Then back to the hotel to prepare for a Presque Isle block party. All tour cars were invited to park on Main Street (AKA Route 1) along with food trucks and vendors and a live band called Star City Syndicate. Only in northern Maine can you close down Route 1 for a party. It was a perfect night for a car show/street fair/concert/dance party!

Friday an 8 AM start again and off to Loring Air Force Base in Houlton. The base was in operation from 1947 to 1994. This location was critical with a crucial role in the nation's defense during the Cold War, housing long-range bombers capable of carrying nuclear weapons. Much of the infrastructure still exists, like bunkers, hangars and runways, along with the buildings that house the community that lived on base. There is a little museum stuffed with artifacts, photos and documents. After the museum we headed to the runway for some fun. The runway used to

handle landings of B-52 bombers and was an alternate site for the Space Shuttle landing. With 2 runways over 12,000 feet in length you can imagine the real estate taken up. But now for the fun part. We all drove to the far end of the longest runway and then they turned everyone loose. We were allowed to go as fast as we could on a 2 mile straight away! I still cannot believe they let us do that! After breaking the sound barrier, we drove through the outskirts of the base which is now a wildlife refuge. Lunch was hosted by Phil Kilcollins at his farm which also houses over 100 pieces of farm equipment and vehicles.

After lunch some headed to the Maysville Museum and another history program, while others made the trek back to the hotel to relax and get ready for the closing banquet.

The Forum in Presque Isle was the venue for the closing banquet. This was particularly nice because all the cars (that were not yet trailered) were allowed to drive into the building and they were all parked around the floor surrounding us while we had our dinner of steak, lobster and clams. As usual there were some stories told, friends made, and awards presented. Of note, someone in our group received special notice for the LOUDEST car. Maybe you could guess who that was?



After a week of seeing the sights in northern Maine we headed home. As usual I am so glad I made the trip. We saw more of the country, learned a few things, laughed, lost a phone, found said lost phone, and had cars break down. The Maine Region is small, but it is the ONLY region in Maine, so it covers the whole state! They took good care of us and put on a great tour. Touring is so important to the future of this hobby, I hope you take a look at the schedule for next year and think about joining the fun. You do not even need a car! Plenty of folks spend less money and just hitch rides with a different driver every day, our National Board Members do it all the time, so can you!
