

# AACA Sentimental Tour 2026.

## Oakland-Pontiac Worldwide Region & Gettysburg Region

The OPW Region and Gettysburg Region of AACA will be hosting the 2026 AACA National Sentimental Tour from **June 15 thru June 19, 2026** in the Mechanicsburg, Pa. and surrounding areas.

The Sentimental Tour is a 5 day tour for 1928 thru 1958 stock [non modified] vehicles and was first hosted in 2001. It is hosted by an AACA Region in even numbered years. An exception can be made for a 1926 ,1927 and any pre 1928 Oakland. No vehicle newer than 1958 will be accepted on the tour. We need to have **50** cars registered for the tour. The tour will be open to all AACA members.

The host hotel is the Fairfield by Marriott, 503 Winding Creek Blvd. Mechanicsburg, Pa. 17050. The hotel is 2 years old with a pool and fitness center located just off exit 57 on Interstate 81. Forty rooms have been reserved for the tour at \$119.00, plus taxes, per night. The price includes breakfast.

Trailer and motorhome parking [no hookups] are adjacent to the hotel. You can book your room by calling 717-795-1918 using the code AACA. I would recommend booking your room on June 14 as the opening banquet will be Sunday 6/14 with the closing banquet on Friday evening 6/19.

Each day's tour will start and end at the host hotel and we will have a hospitality room at the hotel for evening socializing. Most touring will be on 2 lane scenic country roads with daily directions provided. The price [yet to be determined] will be inclusive with dinner on your own Monday thru Thursday evenings. Many restaurants from fast food to fine dining are located a mile from the hotel.

Tentative schedule as follows as follows:

**Sunday Evening-Opening banquet at Vissagio's.**

**Monday-Visit Don Barlup's 1926 service station in New Bloomfield for coffee stop. Tour Perry County covered bridges with box lunch at Little Buffalo state park.**

**Tuesday-Visit Army Heritage center in Carlisle with a presentation on The Carlisle Indian School with lunch there. Optional stop at Carlisle antique mall.**

**Wednesday-Visit Fort Hunter mansion and grounds with a box lunch. Travel to Halifax for a tour of the Lake Tobias wild animal park.**

**Thursday-Visit the Eastern Museum of Motor Racing and private collection featuring Cadillacs in Dillsburg Pa.**

**Friday-Visit the Rolls Royce Museum with a coffee stop in Mechanicsburg and tour a private car and sign collection in Camp Hill. Closing banquet at Vissagio's a mile from the host hotel.**

## IN MEMORY OF

**EDNA B. NORRIS**

**July 16, 1943 - October 15, 2025**



Here are some special memories of Edna, as quoted by a few of our members who knew her well.

Valerie Wynne remembers:

Everyone knew Edna by her 1970 red Volkswagen. She was a member of the South Jersey Region for 25 years. According to Ron Scott, Edna kept meticulous records, not allowing any bills to be paid without a receipt. She managed the club accounts as if they were her own. Ron also recalls that Edna and her Husband Guilford (aka Dead Eye) were the first to volunteer to help with club events like the Amish Market Car Show and Cowtown Swap Meet.

When Lew Zane passed away and wife Sandy no longer was able to run the Elmer Day Car Show, Edna took on the task.

My grandson, Andrew recalls Edna, who he called "Aunt Edna", took him for a ride in the Volkswagen, when he was little, from the Glassboro Diner to the parade route where our cars were lined up, to meet PopPop (my husband Bill). Andrew is now 26 but that kind of gesture made a lasting impression on him.

I remember being in the Salem Christmas Parade and after it ended several of us went to visit the Antique shops where Edna and I found a set of snowmen salt and pepper shakers we both liked. I said I really only wanted one snowman and Edna said she also only wanted one. They were \$5 for the pair. So each of us paid \$2.50 and we both had one snowman.

Gary & Bonnie Green Remembers:

Anytime Edna had visitors, she would walk them to the door and go outside on the step when they were leaving. No matter how bad she was feeling. When she was in her wheel chair, she would shuffle her feet and follow you to the elevator. I think she was just making sure you left.

Edna loved chocolate milk shakes. One time Bonnie and I took her a chocolate "frosty" and she looked at us with a look and said: "This isn't a shake from Broadway Scoops. Next time bring one from Scoops."

Edna was a stickler for details. I never had to worry about the Swap Meet money while she was in the office. She could tell you where all the money came from at the end of the day. She had different piles of money with a note and paper clips attached to each pile. A couple of days later Chuck and I would meet with her to count all the money collected. And, she remembered where it all came from.

I was her handyman around the house. When I worked on things that needed parts, she would say "wait a minute". She would go and get the original manual and receipts (no matter how old) of items I was working on. Items would have the date purchased written on it somewhere.

Chuck Gibson Remembers:

When Edna and her husband Gilford first joined SJR they were eager to jump in and help with club events including our swap meet which was then held at Cowtown. Members would eat at the restaurant in the center of the rear building at Cowtown and simply sign their name on a paper which the restaurant turned into me to pay the food bill at the end of the event. One name kept appearing and I didn't know who it was. So, at the next meeting I asked "who the hell is Deadeye?" Gilford jumped right up and claimed the nickname! We got a lot of laughs over that.

Several years ago, SJR member Bobby Chalow had to have surgery which required a multi-day hospital stay. With his wife Theresa's health concerns, he asked Edna if she would consider staying at their home and caring for Theresa during his absence. She was reluctant to agree and called Joyce and I to help with her decision. We agreed to go to Bob and Theresa's home each evening during Edna's stay, take them to dinner or just visit for a few hours to help Edna with any chores. This eased Edna's mind a lot, knowing that others were there for her and Theresa and those evenings were enjoyable for all four of us!

I was treasurer before Edna for six years. Edna agreed to run for the office at a time when my business workload was commanding a great deal of my time. She had audited the books for me in the past so I knew she would be good at the job! Edna guarded SJR's money like it was her own and made sure that any refund request was accompanied by the appropriate receipt before a check was issued. Being "old school" in nature, she only like to pay bills with a check and scoffed at the idea of the club having a credit card or debit card. Even after I became treasurer once again, she and I often discussed SJR's finances, and she was quick to ask me a lot of questions!
